The School

IPS opened its door on April 15th, 1999 and today accepts students from Nursery to Grade IX. It is affiliated to the Council for ICSE Exams, New Delhi (School Code WB261). It follows the council's curriculum which is considered amongst the best for secondary education in the country.

Academic Session

The new session starts on first week of April of every year culminating with the Annual Examination held in March of the next year. Our second languages are Hindi, Bengali and third languages are Bengali, Hindi and Punjabi. French is taught as a compulsory subject from Grade V-VIII.

Administration

The school has been constantly implementing new activities and innovative teaching methods, backed up by a sound administrative system. The school is bringing about inter school interactive programmes for the expansion of the horizon of the School Community.

Facilities

Highly professional and motivated **teachers** take care of academics with classroom strength not exceeding 35 children. IPS provides a child centred education encouraging initiative, creativity, critical thinking, communication skill and leadership qualities.

The school has well equipped spacious, airy and well lit **Science Laboratories** (Physics, Chemistry and Biology) and a large rich library. The School has installed Digital Boards to enhancing teaching through audio-visual aids.

An advanced **computer education** laboratory, an air-conditioned activity hall, comfortable sick room and pure filtered potable water cooler round the clock.

The co curricular and extra-curricular **activities** focus on all round development of the personality of the child promoting an enlightened mind in a healthy body. Regular educational excursions and various outdoor activities with other schools are conducted.

These activities are designed to strengthen, preserve and promote our ancient, rich diverse and vibrant cultural heritage.

The School offers a grassy **playground** and beautiful garden with rides for children of lower classes and outdoor games and athletics. Students have regular classes in Music, Yoga, Art and Craft.

Transport facility for distant destinations under supervision of Teacher-in-charge as per vacancy is available.

Admission

If you are interested in entrusting your ward to our care please contact the Principal/Office.

Forms and prospectus will be available from 1st October of the year preceding the academic session.

1. For Admission to the respective classes by April 1 of the year of admission, child's completed age must be as follows:

Nursery	3 Years +	Class IV	9 Years +
Kindergarten-I	4 Years +	Class V	10 Years +
Kindergarten-II	5 Years +	Class VI	11 Years +
Class I	6 Years +	Class VII	12 Years +
Class II	7 Years +	Class VIII	13 Years +
Class III	8 Years +	Class IX	14 Years +

2. Admission to Nursery to Kindergarten II classes will be on first come first serve basis and on availability of seats. Admission to classes I and above will be on the basis of interview / report card of previous school.
3. Birth Certificate must be produced for admission. Students who have attended other school must produce a school leaving / transfer certificate at the time of admission.
4. A notice of two calendar months must be given in writing before the withdrawal of a child or fees for two months are to be paid in lieu thereof. In no case will a transfer certificate be issued until all dues are paid and the child should have completed at least one academic session in the school. Application for TC must be submitted with Rs.100/-
5. Decisions regarding admission of a child is at the discretion of the Principal.

Uniform

Parents / Guardians are requested ensure that their children wear correct uniform as per the colour and shade approved by the school. The school uniform will be available at the shops which are authorized by the school.

WINTER UNIFORM

Nursery - Class IV

Boys : Full pants, full sleeves shirt, sweater.

Girls : Frocks or tunics with stockings, V neck sweater.

Class V - Class X

Boys : Full pants, Full or Half Sleeves shirt, Blazers.

Girls : Skirts, Full or half Sleeves shirt, Blazers.

Timings

Nursery to KG II : 8:55 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Class I - X : 8:05 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

A small recess of 30 minutes will enable children to eat their tiffin and stretch their little limbs in the playground.



Guardian Meeting

As we are a community of learners with the children being the most vital members, we seek utmost cooperation from the parents. Regular Parent Teacher meetings will be conducted to help parents gauge the progress of their children. The home assignment pages and parent-teacher communication pages in the diary provide additional avenues for the dialogue to be maintained.

Identity

Children in all classes must wear an **identity badge** or **card** provided by the school. The card will bear identification particulars and a passport size photograph of the child. Guardians of all children must carry an **identity card** bearing identification particulars of the child. This is necessary in order to a) facilitate release of the child after school gets over. and b) be allowed into the school premises for meetings with school authority. The Identity Badge and Identity Card must be signed by the Principal. Loss of Identity Badge or Identity Card must be immediately reported to the school authorities.
